



Ontario's Government Investing in supports for High Risk Seniors in Pickering

February 21, 2020

PICKERING, ON –Today, the Honourable Peter Bethlenfalvy, President of the Treasury Board and MPP Pickering-Uxbridge visited Community Care Durham to announce funding to launch a new Assisted Living Services for High Risk Seniors hub in Pickering. An investment of \$302,780 in base operating funding to Community Care Durham will allow local residents to benefit from this efficient and cost effective program.

The Assisted Living Services (ALS) for High Risk Seniors program supports the needs of high risk seniors to enable them to continue to reside at home by providing the availability of personal support, homemaking, security checks and reassurance services on a scheduled and/or unscheduled basis 24/7.

Community Care Durham in collaboration with the Central East Local Health Integration Network (LHIN) have begun transitioning patients to the ALS hub in the area of 1420 Bayly Street in Pickering. The hub boundaries extend to include the area within a 5 kilometre radius of this address.
